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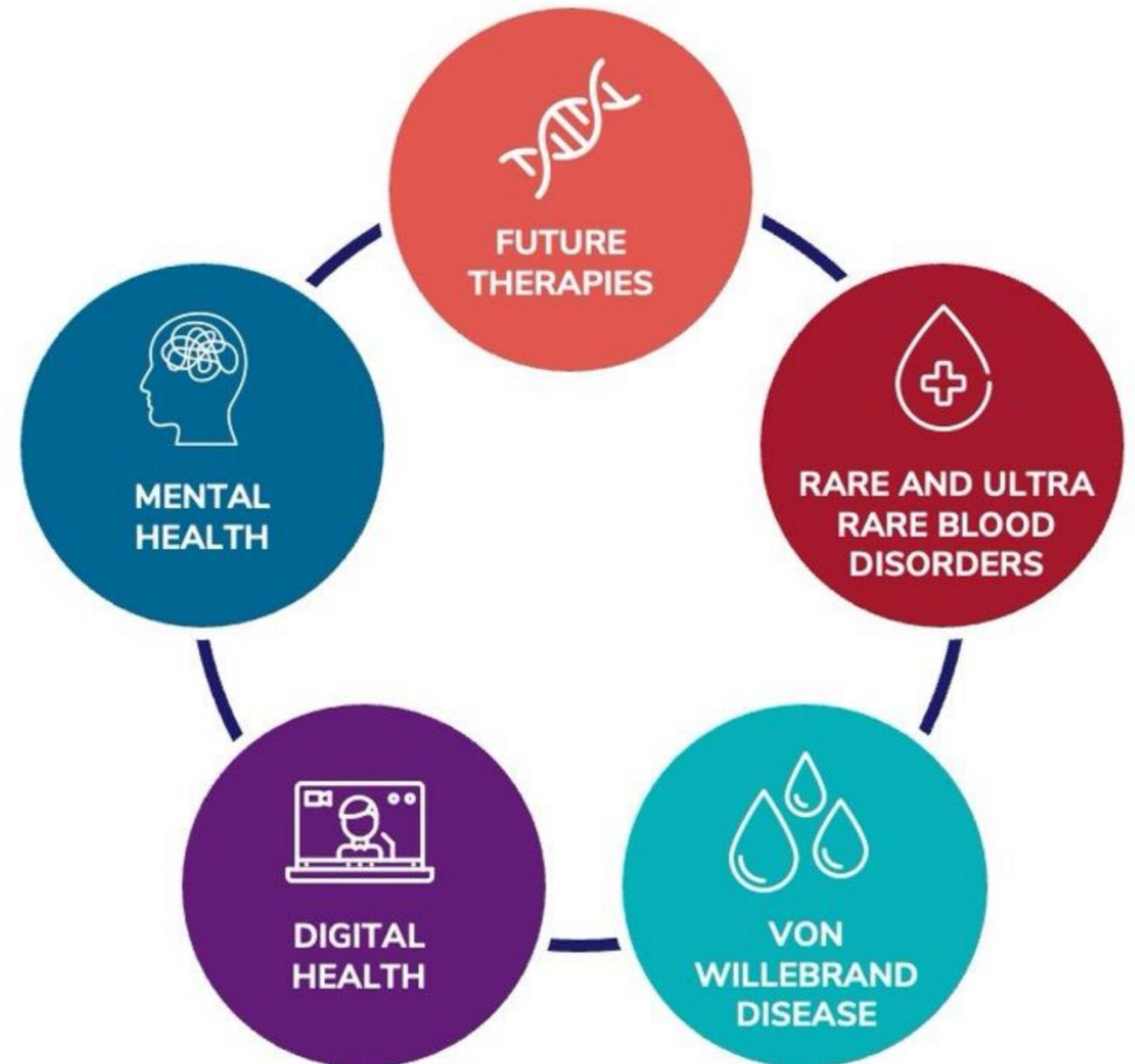

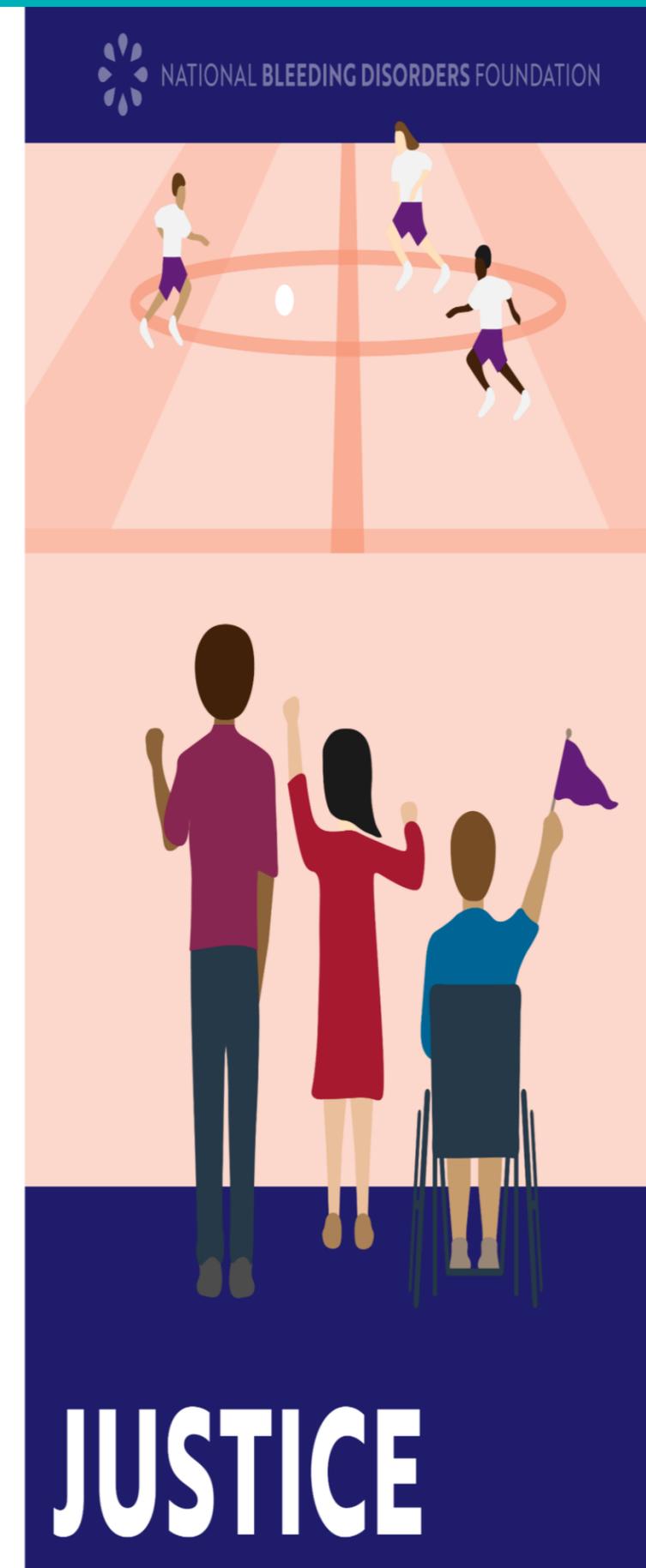
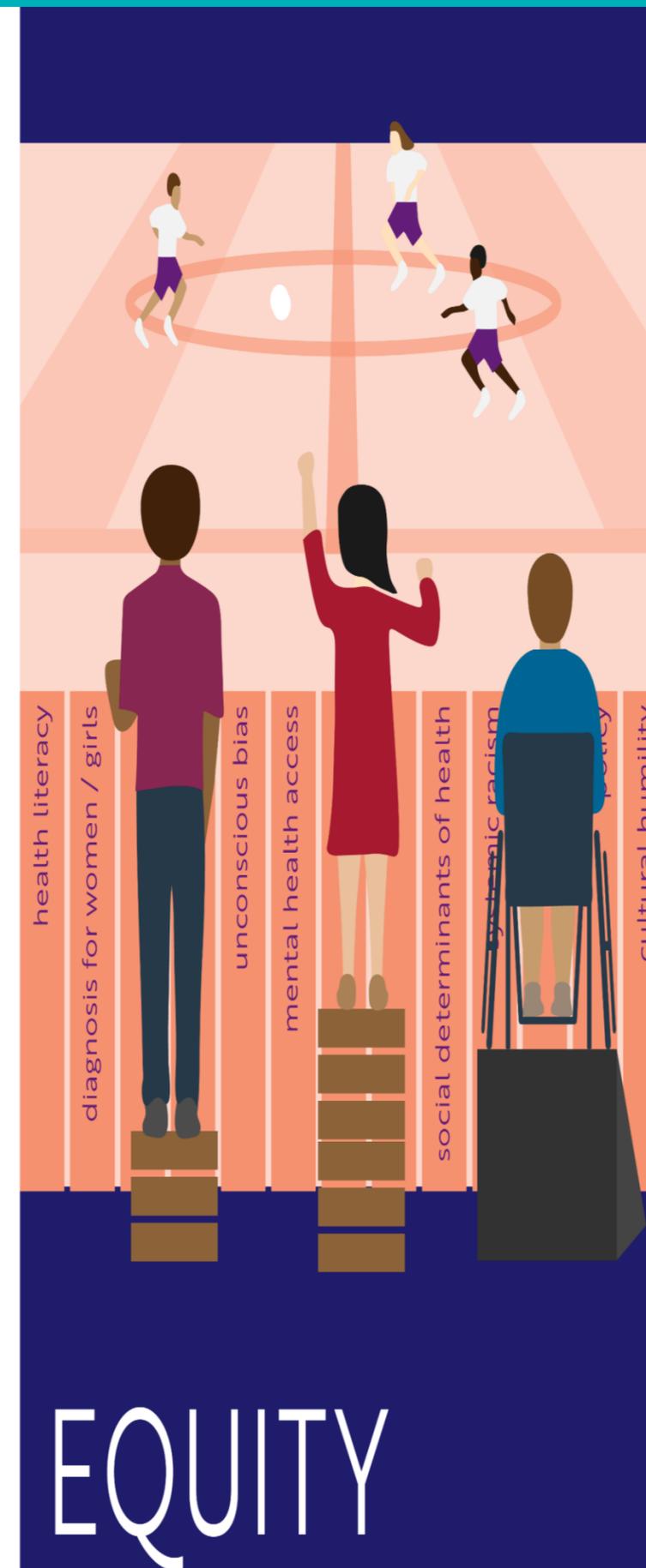

7. Practicing cultural humility with cultural competence

9. Addressing systemic barriers and unconscious bias

10. Addressing policy needs for BD community (including insurance literacy and copay accumulators)



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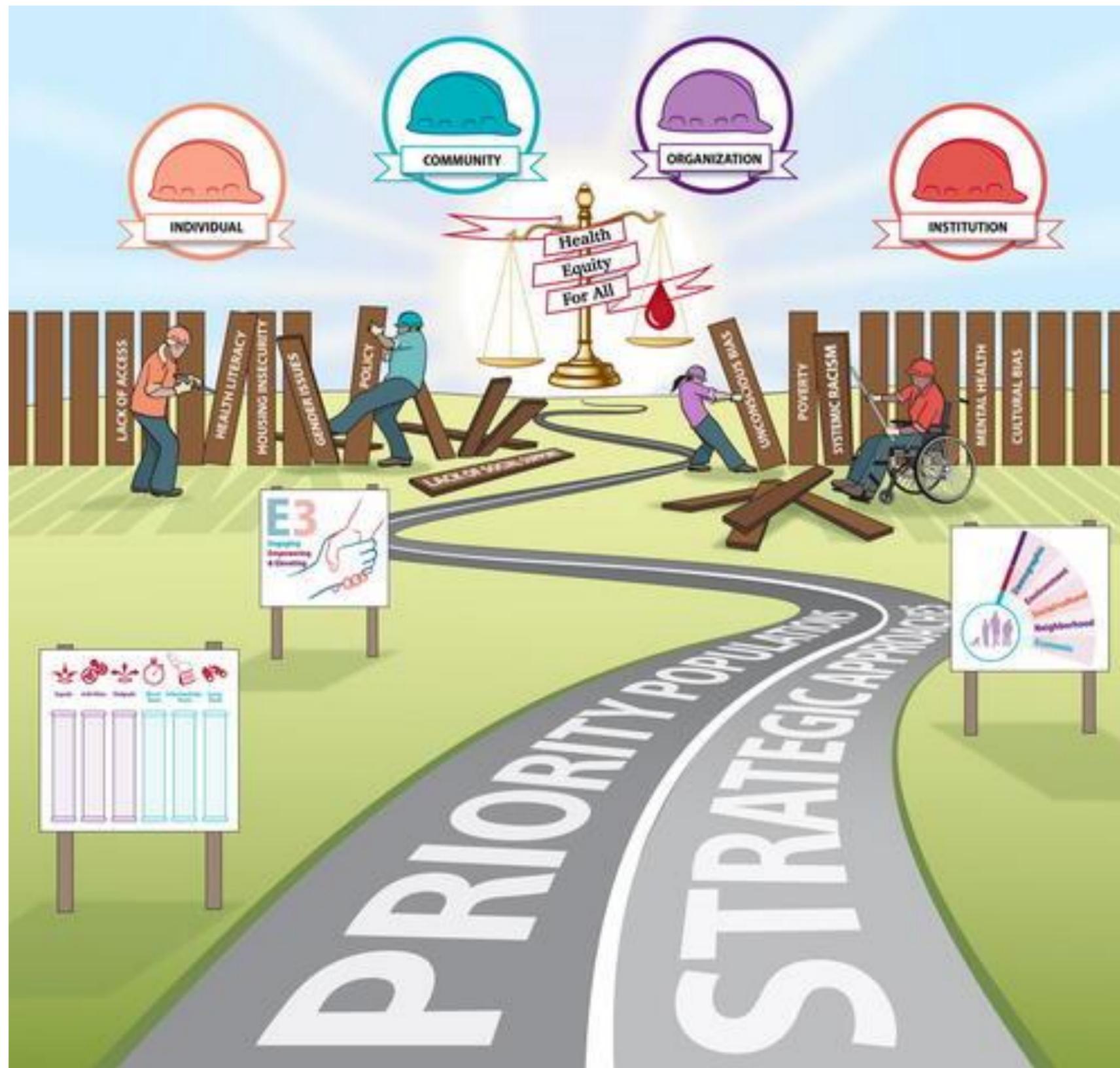

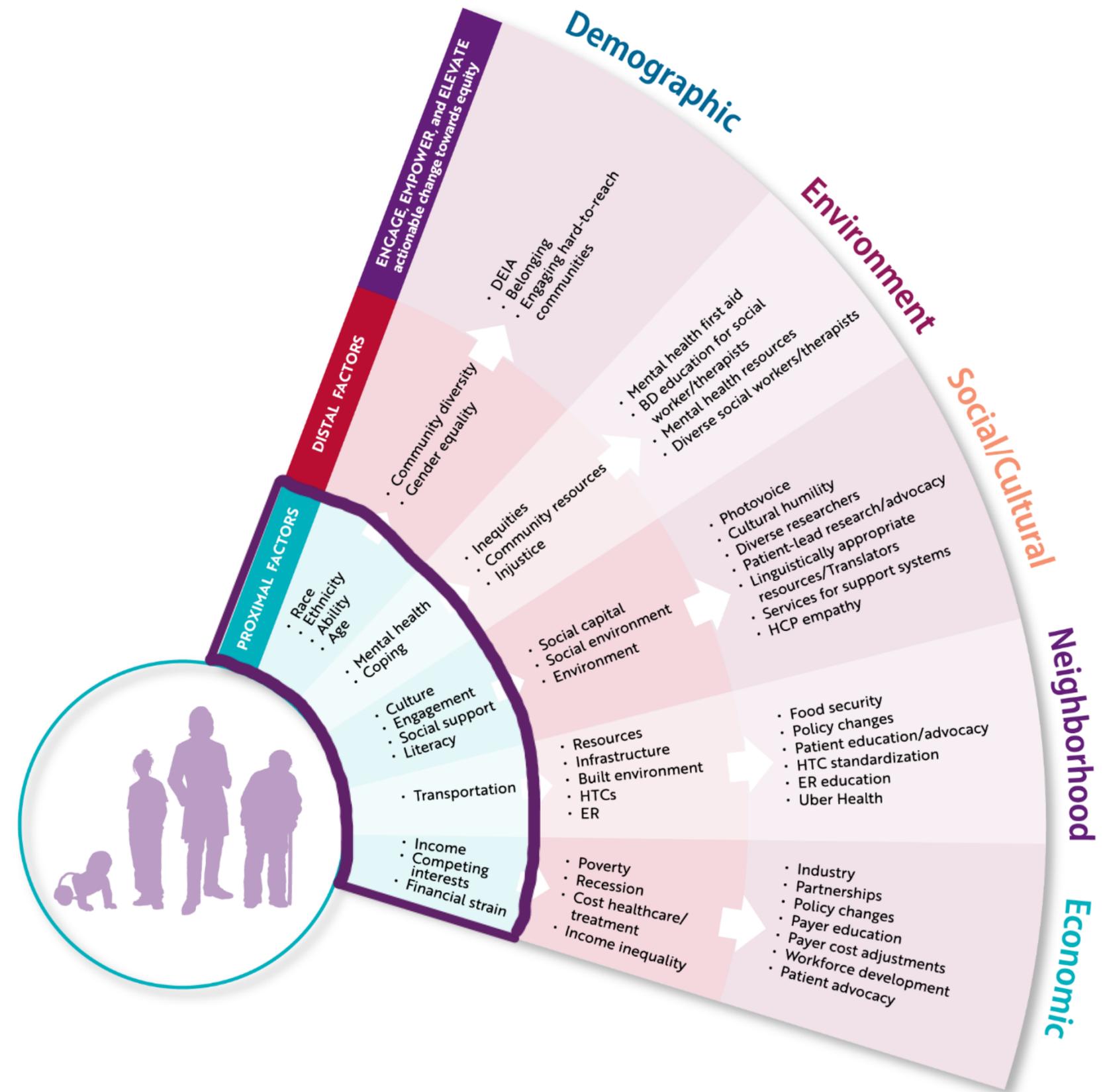
# Definitions

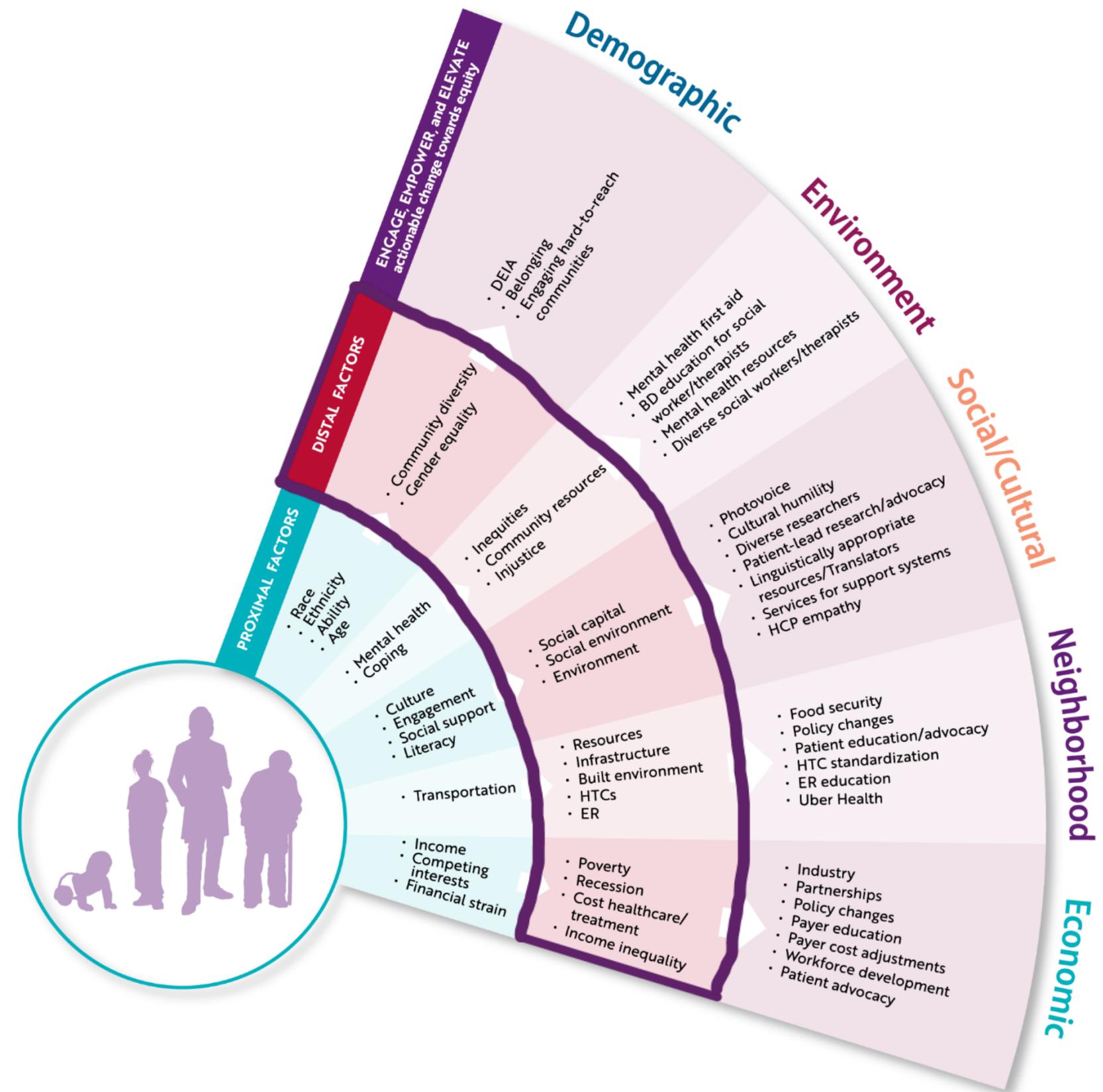
- **Proximal** – circumstances of daily life that have a direct influence on health
- **Distal** – circumstances of life that have an indirect influence on health
- **Individual** – yourself
- **Community** – chapter; group living in the same space
- **Organizational** – NBDF
- **Institutional** – CDC; NIH

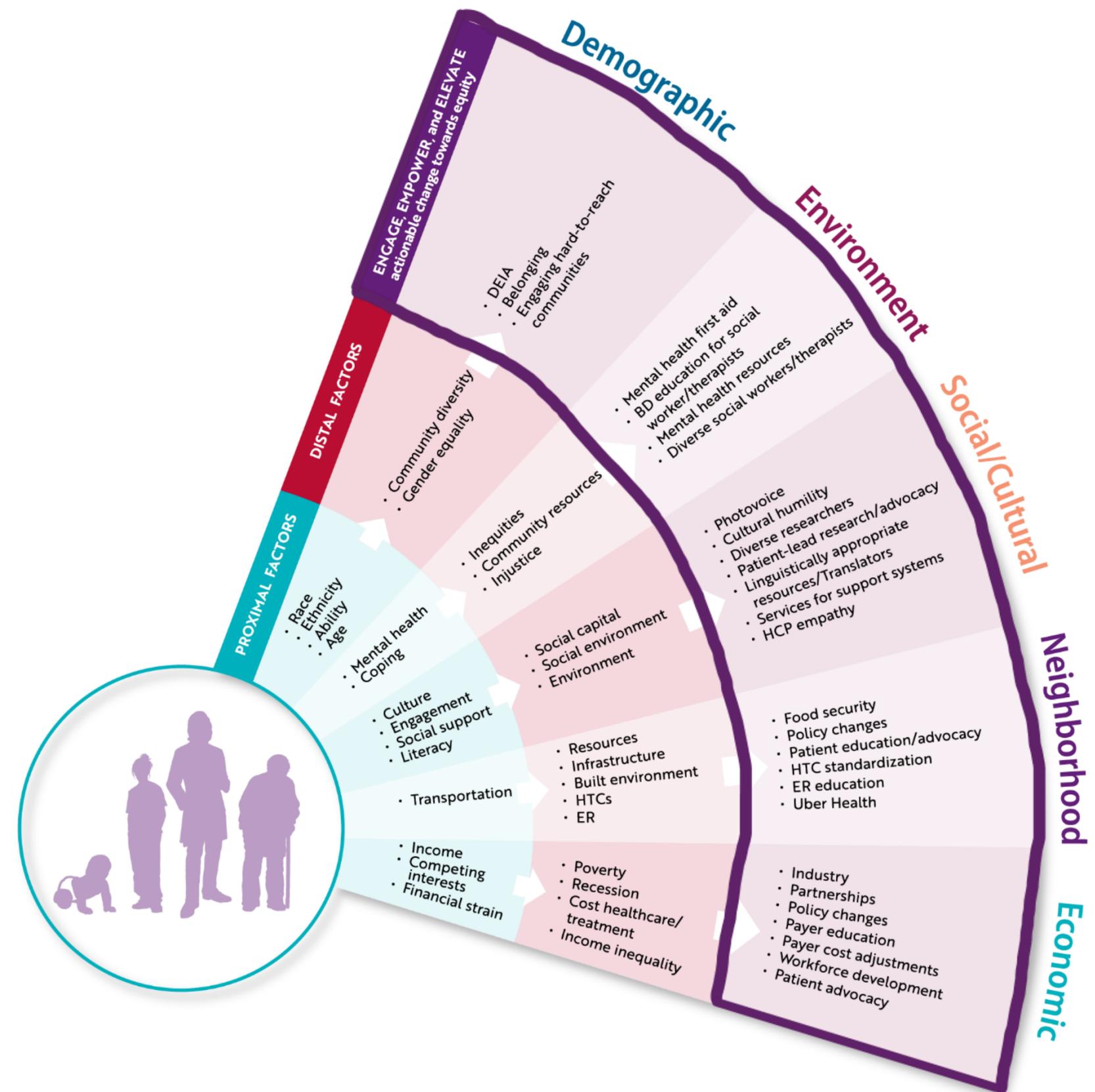
